Objectives

Eastlands Primary School has a strong commitment to the added value of learning beyond the school premises by the use of carefully planned Educational visits.

Every child has an entitlement to a wide range of educational experiences. Eastlands Primary school has a role to provide a broad and balanced curriculum that promotes spiritual, moral, social, cultural, mental and physical development and prepares young people for the opportunities and experiences of adult life.

Each year the school will arrange a number of activities that take place off the school site and/or out of school hours, which support the aims of the school, as well as providing first hand experiences and bringing the curriculum to life.

Aims:

A visit to the theatre has the potential to be a life-changing experience, as well as an opportunity for a unique kind of learning. It can touch the imagination, arouse curiosity, or fire an artistic impulse. Theatre can also be an exceptional resource, linking as it does to so many areas of knowledge: history, geography, language, citizenship, and much more. Learning in theatres has its own skills-set – theatrical literacy and the understanding of dramatic conventions, a specialised vocabulary, and the ability to sit and watch a performance without distraction.

- If your child is in receipt of Free School Meals (Years 3-6) and you would like the kitchen to provide a packed lunch (**Deli bag option only**). please order online by **Monday 16th November**.
